Registering Rental Properties

The Town Commission has adopted Ordinance 603 which requires individuals renting their single family homes to register with the Town. Unfortunately some homeowners have ignored this regulation. This has created a problem and a nuisance for their neighbors because of new renters coming and going and in some cases ignoring the peace and tranquility that our residents expect and deserve in Ocean Ridge. Therefore, to develop knowledge as to where the renters are located the Commission adopted this ordinance requiring registration. This is also a safety issue for our residents. Many times we don't know of a problem until a neighbor has to complain about excessive noise and a multitude of renters roaming the area. Fortunately most of the renters are wonderful neighbors and don't create any problems. However, as in many instances there are always a few that try to take advantage of a situation.

We appreciate the homeowners working with us and registering their homes with the Town when they become involved in a rental program. The fee for registration is \$50 per lease and can be accomplished by registering at Town Hall (registration form on page 8). The Town still has an existing regulation that homes cannot be rented for less than 30 days at a time and the violators are cited as necessary. We greatly appreciate your cooperation with this program as we believe it's to the benefit of our permanent residents.

Recipe: Open Tuna Melt

Ingredients:

- 1/4cup cream cheese spread
- 1/4cup Miracle Whip dressing
- 2 cans (6.5oz each) tuna, drained, flaked
- 1 stalk celery, chopped
- 4 green onions, sliced
- 4 slices white bread, toasted
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

Directions:

Heat oven 400F. Mix cream cheese spread and dressing in medium bowl until blended. Stir in tuna, celery, and onions. Place toast slices in single layer on baking sheet. Spoon tuna mixture evenly onto toast slices; sprinkle with cheddar. Bake 5mins or until cheese has melted. Serves 4.



September's Regular Town Commission Meeting Action Summary

The following list is actions taken at the Sept. 10, 2013 meeting:

1. Approved the Regular Town Commission Meeting minutes of Aug. 5, 2013 with one minor change
2. Approved a Tentative Budget in the Amount of \$5,639,526 for the 2013/14 Operating Fund, with a Tentative Millage of \$5.3500, and Announced that Computed Millage Rate is 3.64% more than the Rolled Back Rate of \$5.1621 and Announced that the Final Budget Adoption Hearing will be held on Tuesday, Sept. 17, 2013 at 5:01 PM
3. Proclaimed September as "National Sickle Cell Month"
4. Approved a Land Development Permit for construction east of the Coastal Construction Control Line (CCCL) to construct a single family home, reflecting pool, and 5 car garage/ staff quarters at 6273 N Ocean Blvd.
5. The Commission deferred the Request for Lien Reductions at 6011 N Ocean Blvd. until the October 7, 2013 meeting
6. Consensus for the Town Attorney to remain as counsel pertaining to the Lawsuit related to the Inspector General
7. Approved the Employee Health Insurance through NHP (Policy HSA-XV-7) Effective Oct. 1, 2013
8. Approved Insurance Coverage for Workers, Comp, General and Auto Liability, Property, Crime with Preferred Government Insurers Trust through Milton Carpenters Insurance at an Annual Cost of 100,910 Effective Oct. 1, 2013
9. Confirmed the Hiring of Dispatcher/Clerk Courtney Giddy with a starting date of Oct. 1, 2013
10. Ratified the \$9,700 payment to Anzco, Inc. from the Capital Projects Fund for the emergency repair to the side walls of Inlet Cay Drive
11. Approved the \$7,467 Bid from Anzco, Inc. to construct the Pedestrian Crosswalk across from Town Hall and authorized an additional \$1,000 to Engenuity Group to complete the inspections and the FDOT engineering certification thereby increasing the initial expense from \$13,500 to \$15,000 from the Contingency Account
12. Directed staff to conduct further research on options for the Old Ocean Blvd. ROW in the area directly east of the four properties located immediately south of Beachway Drive
13. Deferred the discussion on the rezoning of the 5011 Building to the Oct. meeting to allow time to review the engineering report submitted to staff and the Commission on 9/11/13
14. Adopted Resolution No. 2013-07; Providing for Public Participation Guidelines in Accordance with Newly Adopted Senate Bill 50 which is Codified at Sec. 286.0114, Florida Statutes, as well as General Rules of Procedure Governing the Town's Public Meetings – the Commission did request that staff also look at the possibility of including telephonic participation
15. Adopted Resolution No. 2013-08; Approving the Agreement Between the Town of Ocean Ridge and the Town of Briny Breezes for the Purpose of Providing Law Enforcement and Police Protection Services (for a 3 year period)
16. Consensus for Town Attorney to negotiate a request for a possible building permit refund

September's Special Town Commission Meeting Action Summary

The county's Consumer Affairs Division's mission is to make sure that you (the consumer) are protected from unfair, fraudulent and deceptive practices. Just this past year, the division handled over 50,000 phone inquiries, tracked over 22,000 businesses and recovered approximately \$1 million for local consumers.

The Consumer Affairs website is one-stop shopping where you can obtain general information on a business or landlord or file a complaint. Some of the information available includes current and past disputes/

complaints, licensing status, and contact information (website, email and street address, etc.). They also are available regular business hours either in-person or by phone.

Additionally, the Consumer Affairs Division urges you to contact them with any complaints about unfair, fraudulent and deceptive practices. These complaints are vital to their mission of keeping local companies in check and providing accurate information to the consumer.

NEW SCULPTURES, WORKSHOP & RECEPTION FOR AVENUE OF THE ARTS EXHIBIT



OP ART ON DISPLAY TO OPEN ON MAY 13 CONNECTS WITH KINETIC ART IN BOYNTON


BOYNTON BEACH, FL --- A new Art in Public Places “Op Art” exhibit will open May 13 in the City’s Library, featuring Stanford Slutsky’s Kinetic and Optical artwork. Kinetic Art refers to art that moves, or that gives the sensation of movement, through its optical effects. As viewers enjoy and move around the art, the art work’s light, colors and surfaces change dramatically. Optical art is a method of painting that provides an interaction between illusion and picture plane, between understanding and seeing. Op art works are abstract. When viewed, the impression of movement, hidden images, flashing, vibration, patterns, or alternatively, of swelling or warping.

Slutsky’s optical art is composed of precisely cut wooden geometric shapes all fitting together to give the illusion of depth and distance. Slutsky works are meticulously created by cutting wood with table saws and jig-saws, separating them into pieces with spacers and fitting them perfectly with their counterparts on a canvas or in a frame. Slutsky uses magnets to piece together many of his works, making these removable, though not noticeable at first, they become an interesting surprise to the viewer. He also created painted acrylics pieces on wrapped canvas that have become popular among collectors.

Inspired by Victor Vassarely, Slutsky achieves his effects by juxtaposing hard-edged color patterns that disrupt the normal process of vision. Some shapes of color seem to advance and then recede; others appear to pulsate in waves. Slutsky painstaking, semi-scientific approach to painting and mixed media constructions are based on the manipulation of optical devices and depend on subtle color gradations, systematic chromatic harmonic lines and shapes.

All pieces created by Slutsky are one-of-a-kind and for sale with commissions benefitting the Art in Public Places program and Friends of the Library. **The Stanford Slutsky “Op Art” exhibit begins May 13 and continues through December 5.** Art in Public Places and the City Library will host a meet the artist reception Saturday, June 8, 2- 4 pm. 


