## Municipal Election Results

The 2017 Municipal Election resulted in 585 cast ballots (1633 registered voters) which is a 35.82% turnout. The results were as follows: Gail Aaskov 175; Phil Besler 330; Kristine de Haseth 424. During the Regular Town Commission Meeting on April 2 the two new commissioners were sworn in by Town Clerk, Tracey Stevens. (See photos Below). ## Concept Plan Review

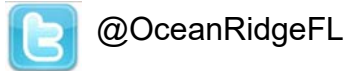

# Town Manager's Report

Below is The Town Manager's Report—April's Commission Meeting:



## Congratulations & Welcome New Commission Members!

## South-End Drain Systems Projects Update

Town surveying for ROW drainage projects along Dolphin Bend revealed the areas of attention are actually entirely contained within the private property plats of 101 and 111 Dolphin Bend. The Town is setting up meetings with the property owners to discuss granting the Town utility/drainage easements, or other options in order to assist in improving overall drainage issues there. As private property, the Town cannot enact public infrastructure projects, leaving remedy to the property owners.

For installation of a new inline drain catch basin at Beachway and Osprey Drives, quotes came in higher than anticipated (attached for reference). I recommend we wait until just after "season" to find contractors not already overbooked that may provide more affordable quotes for this simple job.

## Certified Building Official

We held in-person interviews with 3 candidates for an in-house CBO (Certified Building Official). Our offers have been countered with higher salary requests than advertised range, budgeted at \$72K. The market has lots of openings, with fewer credentialed candidates than to fill them. We have a great interested local candidate working for another jurisdiction. Town Manage sought consensus to negotiate higher than originally advertised salary level to land the best credentialed, capable candidate for the Town. There is no practical budgetary impact in FY18 as we are halfway through the current year, but the salary and multiplier line items would go up slightly in FY19.

## Public Beach Crossover Updates

The bridge structure at Anna Street was removed and left in natural condition at ground-level while we explore a pathway leading to the landing/steps on the seaward side, like our Edith Street configuration. Our public works personnel performed the removal work admirably and efficiently. We will seek quotes for the design/installation of a ground-level path solution at this location, with DEP input.

I've circulated a lot of emails and information from our citizens' opinions of the crossovers issues and preferences. The commission will be getting much more in-depth information on this topic as we schedule site-specific recommendations for each of the Town's crossover amenities and propose design/build upgrades in the future under your direction and appropriations during future meetings.

## Turtle Season—March 1 through October 31

Turtle season runs from March 1 through October 31. Throughout the season, Ocean Ridge Tidings may provide you with interesting and informative turtle updates from Palm Beach County Environmental Resources Management when available. In addition, there are flyers and small table top signs available at town hall for residents, condo and homeowner associations to display. Supplies are limited.

There are three sea turtle species that nest in Palm Beach County and they are the endangered green and leatherback, and the threatened loggerhead. Artificial lighting may deter females from nesting and can prevent hatchlings from reaching the water. Please adjust or extinguish all beach lighting to protect the turtles laying eggs and nesting on the beaches. Beach furniture and other obstacles on the beach may block access to suitable nesting locations so please remove them as well.

- ◆ You can help the sea turtles by following these tips:
- ◆ Turn off non-essential beachfront lighting.
- ◆ Replace incandescent & fluorescent bulbs with red or amber LED bulbs.
- ◆ Reduce lighting visible from the beach by lowering shielding, recessing, and/or redirecting fixtures.
- ◆ Use draperies or blinds to reduce interior lighting.
- ◆ Be turtle friendly by removing chairs, toys, floats, and boats from the beach at night.
- ◆ Replace wooden cabanas with lighter alternatives.

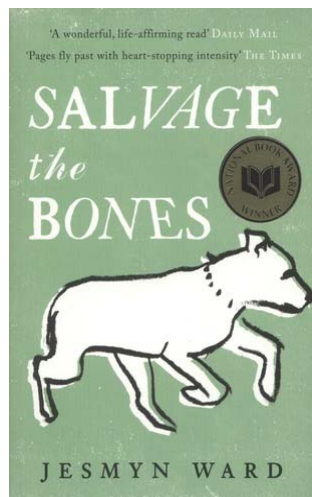

## WELCOME OUR NEWEST MEMBER

The police department welcomes the addition of Michael Parkerson to our ranks. Officer Parkerson joins us from Parhump, Nevada and is a Florida Native who has extensive law enforcement experience in local, state and federal areas.

## Ordinances

Town Ordinances are often an area of interest. As your police department we are also tasked with enforcement of the Town Codes. As this is the case, we are showcasing some of the common ordinances we encounter on a regular basis. This month's highlight is on placement of Trash and Garbage curbside for collection and General Maintenance of properties.

### Chapter 42 - SOLID WASTE

(a)

Generally.

(1) *Placement of rubbish on public property or property of another. It shall be unlawful for any person to place any lumber, wood, iron, glass, box, barrel, rubbish, trash, brush, logs, debris, paper or any obstruction of any kind whatsoever upon any street, sidewalk, alley, park, lane or other public grounds of the town or upon any publicly dedicated right-of-way or on the land of another without his consent, except that properly containerized garbage, waste and yard trash may be placed no greater than six feet from the street or road abutting the property generating the subject garbage, waste or yard trash to effectuate proper municipal refuse, garbage and yard trash collection.*

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*(2) Containers; time of placement for collection. Except for yard trash, all garbage, waste and refuse shall be properly containerized in either garbage cans or dumpster facilities, or in sealed plastic bags or other acceptable containers as approved by the office of the town manager, and placed at curbside no sooner than 12 hours prior to the day scheduled for regular refuse, garbage and trash collection service as provided pursuant to the town garbage and trash collection contract.*

*(3) Removal of containers. All garbage, waste and refuse containers shall be removed from the curbside of the street or road designated for municipal garbage collection no later than 11:00 p.m. on the day scheduled for garbage, waste and refuse collection.*

*(4) Placement of yard trash. Yard trash shall be piled in an orderly fashion, or containerized in garbage cans or sealed bags, and all be placed no greater than six feet from the street or road abutting the property generating the subject yard trash to effectuate proper municipal yard trash collection. Yard trash shall consist of vegetation only, including, but not limited to, grass clippings, bush or tree trimmings, leaves and weeds, and shall be placed near the street no sooner than 36 hours, or the Sunday prior to the regularly scheduled day of collection.*

*(5) Screening of containers. All garbage, waste and refuse containers shall be effectively screened from view of adjoining property and public rights-of-way when not at curbside.*

*(b) Appeals. Any person aggrieved by the improper use of refuse containers on adjacent premises or any person aggrieved by the application of subsection (a) to his premises shall have the right of appeal to the town commission, which shall have the authority, after due notice and hearing, to confirm, modify or revoke any decision of the town manager relating to the operation and effect of subsection (a).*

*(c) Violations; penalty. Any person violating any of the provisions of this section by failing, neglecting or refusing to comply with its provisions relative to removal of garbage, waste or refuse cans from the curbside within six hours after having been ordered to remove the cans by any town officer, or who shall resist or obstruct the carrying out of the provisions of this section, shall be punishable pursuant to section 1-13.*

*As you can see from the ordinance Trash is scheduled for Tuesday's and Friday's in Ocean Ridge. The placement of specific types is also regulated as well as the duration that trash containers may be left curbside. In addition, no trash or debris should be placed in the roadway or on sidewalks that blocks traffic or pedestrian movement.*

### If you are seasonal:

If you are a seasonal resident we would like to wish you a happy and healthy summer. While you are away please take advantage of our House Watch program for single family homes as well as our Town offered alarm monitoring. In addition, we ask that you check with our dispatchers at the police department and confirm that the emergency contact information for your property is correct and up to date.

The dispatchers are available to assist you 24 hours per day by telephone at (561) 732-8331 as well as in person at the police station lobby.

### If you are a full time resident:

As always, we will be here with you. Please keep an eye on your neighbor's homes and report any suspicious activity you may see. Summer is often a time when those wishing to take advantage of our seasonal residents try to access and use these properties without the owner's knowledge. Your assistance in this matter is always appreciated and a great help to the officers patrolling the Town.

The Town of Ocean Ridge, will be hosting FREE document shredding on Saturday, April 28, 2018 from 9:00AM—12:00PM in the rear parking lot of Town Hall.

This event is open to Ocean Ridge residents only — photo identification is required. Residents are limited to shredding of up to three office storage boxes of personal documents.

The date of this event was selected in conjunction with various Federal Income Tax Deadlines. This will allow an opportunity for residents to discard older, unnecessary personal documents while filing away items from 2016/17. Frequent readers of the Ocean Ridge Tidings e-newsletter are aware of the often listed crimes of Identity Theft and Fraud that are reported monthly. Some of these cases are the result of paperwork (i.e. bank statements & checks, bills, credit cards & receipts, etc.) being improperly disposed of that falls into the hands of criminals.

Please remove all papers from three ring binder type folders. File folders, staples, and paper clips do not need to be removed.
